Its vineyards were planted by a Roman emperor in the 3rd century AD. Since then it has proved to be the one of the most iconic wines of Rhone and the best kept secret outside of France. It is also the smallest single estate appellation, with a size of approximately three football pitches spreaded out on well maintained terraced vineyards. This one should definitely be on your bucket list.

Michel Chapoutier is the rock star of this region. His philosophy and style of wine making has been a driving force for many young winemakers to push improvements in the cellars and work responsibly with the land. His wines display the unique characteristics and the diversity of the Rhone valley by expressing the local grape varieties planted in different location produced with minimum human intervention.

Côte-Rôtie 'La Mouline', E. Guigal Rhône valley in France 2006	£75
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The history of the Guigal family reflects the glory of the wines of the Côte-Rôtie and for centuries, generations of the family have worked the land. La Mouline is one of the flagship wines of the Guigals. The Syrah grape is harvested by hand on the unique terraced vineyards of Côte Blonde which distinguishes itself by its shape, characteristic of a Roman amphitheatre. A very feminine touch is added to this wine by the presence of Viognier which brings elegance to the Syrah.
